Terrestrial Program Strategy



By 2030, 11 million hectares of Indonesia's forests are sustainably managed and 1 million hectares avoided deforestation, contributing to 56 Million tC0²e/year emission reduction, and benefiting the wellbeing of 56,000 people.



Ocean Program Strategy



By 2030, at least 14 million hectares of Indonesia's coastal and marine resources (including the management improvement of 300,000 hectares of mangroves) are sustainably managed to support coastal livelihoods, sustainable fisheries management, and Indonesia's biodiversity with a potential emission reduction of 400,000 tCO²e/year, avoided conversion of 525,000 hectares of identified AoIs and improving the well-being of 84,500 people.
