Target

By 2030, at least **14 million hectares of Indonesia's coastal and marine resources** (including the management improvement of **300,000 hectares of mangroves**) are sustainably managed to support coastal livelihoods, sustainable fisheries management, and Indonesia's biodiversity with a **potential emission reduction of 400,000 tCO₂e/year, avoided conversion of 525,000 hectares** of identified Aols and improving the **well-being of 84,500 people**.
